A highly acclaimed, widely published engineer and academic who is on the forefront of new engineering initiatives, Professor Amadei's main research and teaching interests have initially been in rock mechanics and engineering geology. Currently his interests cover the topics of sustainability and international development.

As the Founding President of Engineers Without Borders - USA and the co-founder of the Engineers Without Borders-International network, Professor Amadei works to partner with disadvantaged communities to improve their quality of life through implementation of sustainable engineering projects, while involving and training internationally responsible engineering professionals and students.

The Nunan Lecture Series, made possible by a gift from the estate of Jim and Marge Nunan in 2006, includes two major research lectures held in the spring and fall of each year.
